

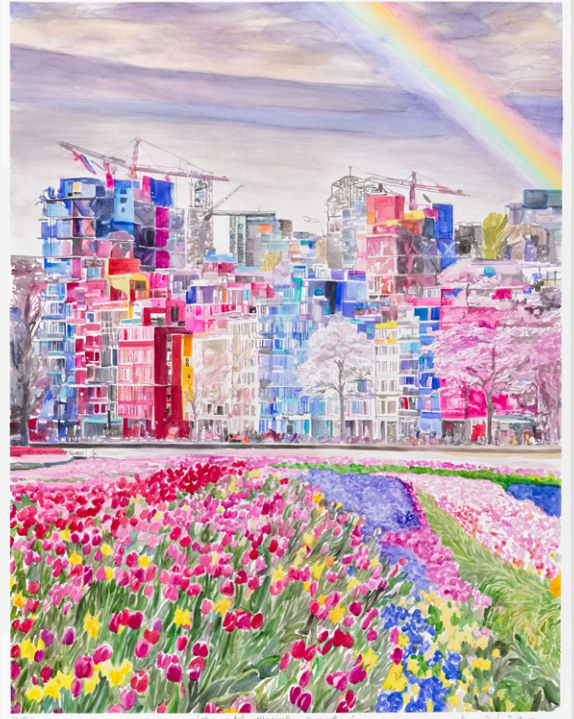
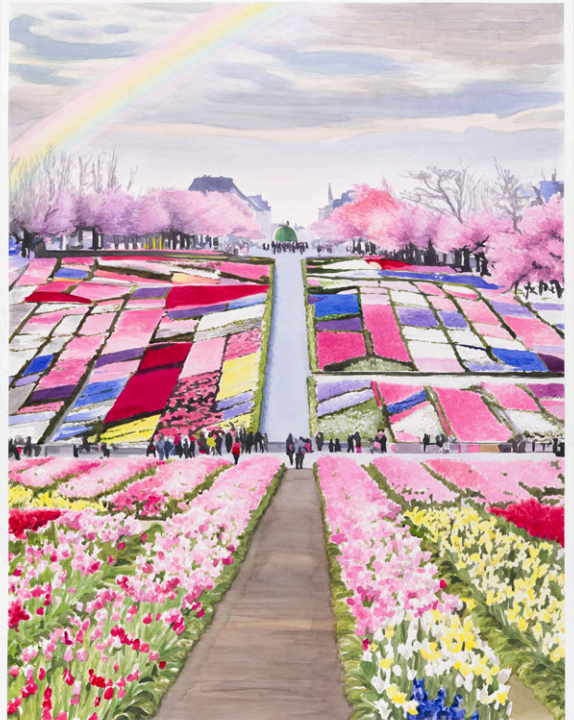

HENI releases new original watercolour works on paper by Damien Hirst

HENI is delighted to present *The Civilisation Watercolours* by Damien Hirst, new original watercolour works on paper that reimagine the thriving urban landscapes from his *The Civilisation Paintings* series. The artworks are available by application exclusively on HENI Primary from 15 January until 17:00 GMT on 26 January 2026.

The artworks are watercolour works on paper and are presented in white, metal frames with Optium Tru Vue acrylic. The artworks come in two sizes, 156.1 x 113.6 cm and 119.1 x 93.6 cm (framed). Each work is titled and hand-signed by Damien Hirst on the front.

In *The Civilisation Watercolours*, Hirst explores the necessity of hope despite the complexities and challenges of contemporary civilisation, a theme first seen in his *The Civilisation Paintings* series. Using vibrant, optimistic colour, Hirst depicts memories or feelings of cities as bright, imagined landscapes in which flourishing plant life is set within urban environments. His scenes reveal an attempt to control the chaos of nature, observed in the planned-out pathways and curated arrangement of flora and trees. These artificial interventions in the landscapes are echoed in the grid-like structures of the buildings.

While in *The Civilisation Paintings* Hirst explores themes of chaos and hope with an anarchic and frenetic energy, in *The Civilisation Watercolours* he does so through a more

meditative lens. Optimism is intertwined with transience, in part aided by Hirst's intentional use of watercolour which lends an ethereal quality to his forms. In places, flower petals dissolve into blots or float away, leaving behind increasingly bare trees, while the tumultuous skies and shining rainbows are reminders that the world is in flux.

The Civilisation Watercolours works are on display at HENI Gallery until 25 January 2026. Admission to the gallery is free.

Damien Hirst (b. 1965) was born in Bristol, England, and lives and works in London, Devon and Gloucestershire, England. Collections include Museo d'Arte Contemporanea Donnaregina, Naples, Italy; Museum Brandhorst, Munich; Museum für Moderne Kunst, Frankfurt am Main, Germany; Stedelijk Museum, Amsterdam; Centro de Arte Dos de Mayo, Madrid; Tate, London; Israel Museum, Jerusalem; Astrup Fearnley Museet, Oslo; Gallery of Modern Art, Glasgow, Scotland; National Centre for Contemporary Arts, Moscow; Museum of Modern Art, New York; Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden, Washington, D.C.; Art Institute of Chicago; The Broad, Los Angeles; Museo Jumex, Mexico City; and 21st Century Museum of Contemporary Art, Kanazawa, Japan.

Hirst received the Turner Prize in 1995.

***"These watercolour paintings are about civilisation. I wanted them to feel like they exist on the edge of real and imaginary and have an element of entropy, I want you to feel that while the buildings are growing they could equally fall down. It's hard to have belief today and we would rather believe in a Disney animation than our own human relationships and that's what I've tried to touch on where I used the bright colours and soft paint, I want these paintings to be very much a part of the history and tradition of watercolour paintings."* — Damien Hirst**

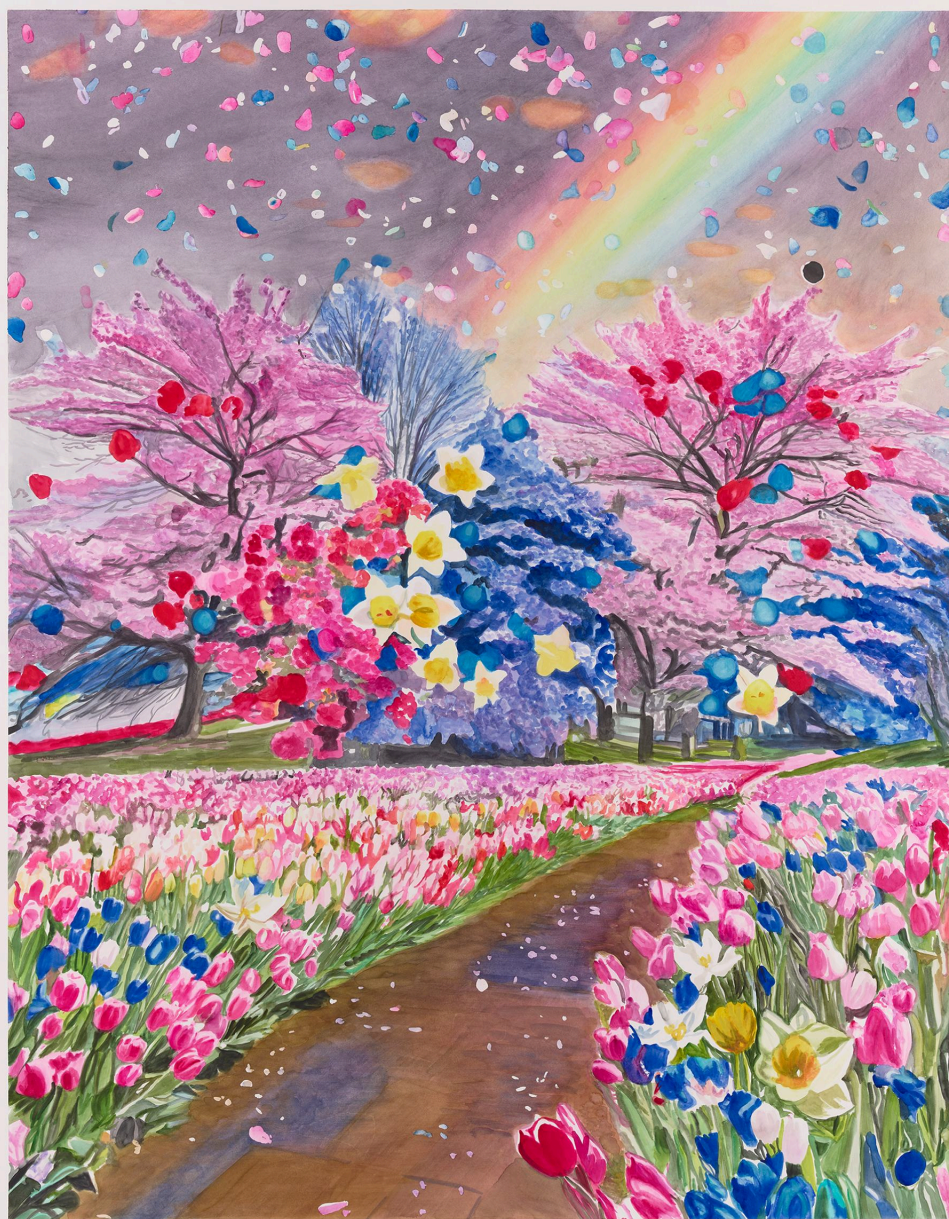

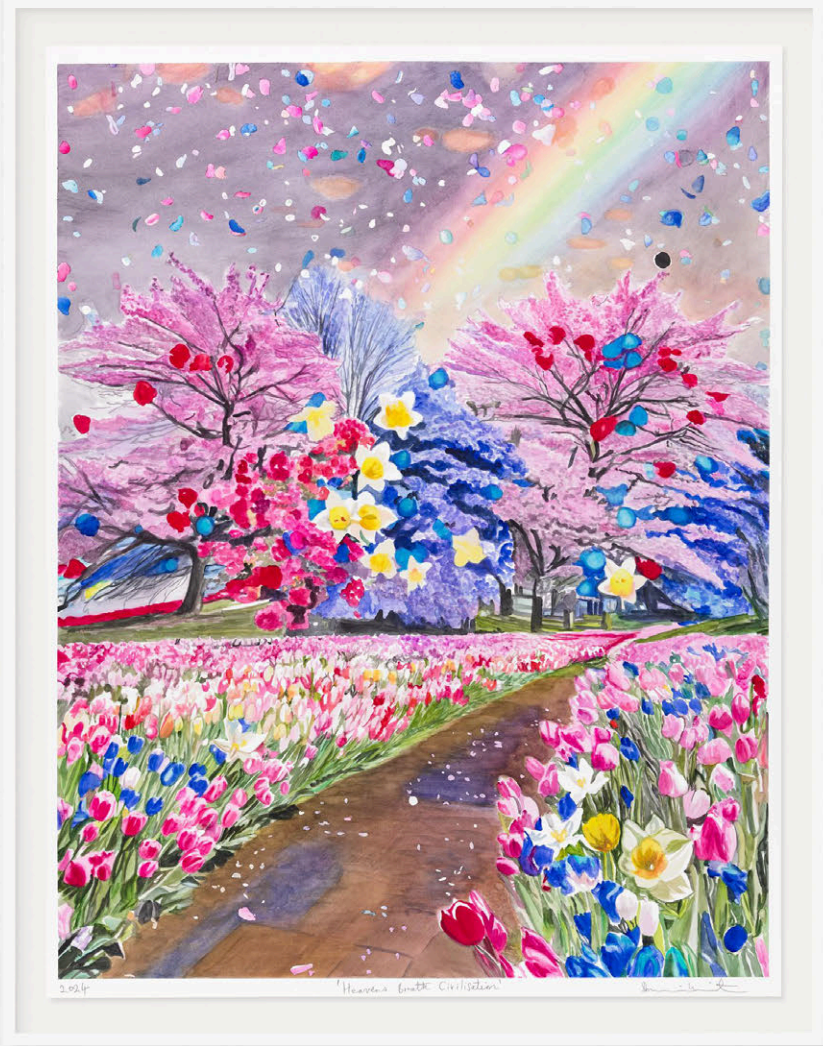

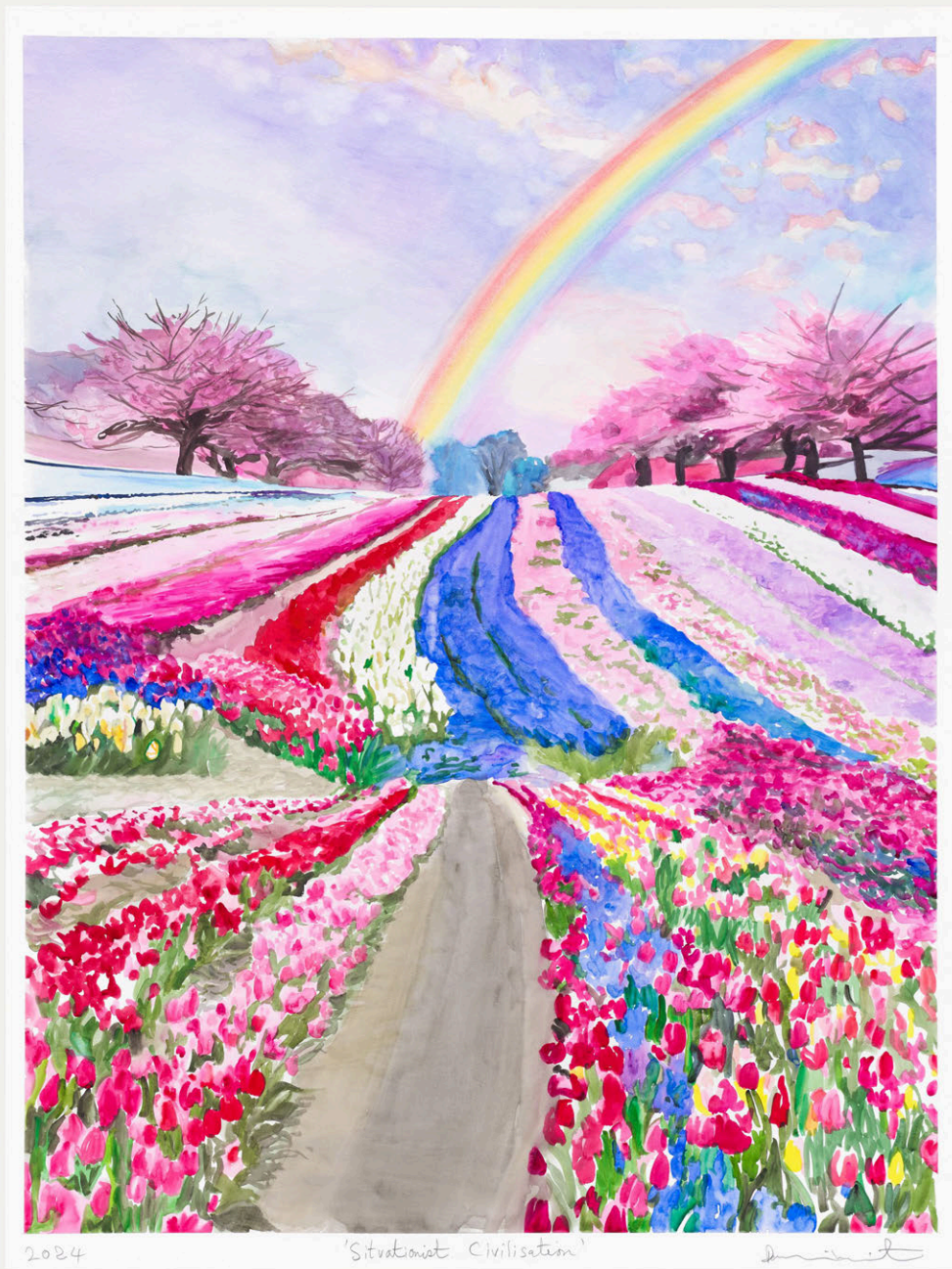
