

HENI Announces Limited Edition Release by Nicola Green: Stars and Stripes and Heirloom

HENI is pleased to announce the release of *Stars and Stripes* and *Heirloom*, a collection of limited-edition silkscreen prints and a tapestry edition by acclaimed artist and social historian Nicola Green. These new works expand upon Green's celebrated *In Seven Days...* series.

Stars and Stripes introduces five new silkscreen print editions, offering collectors fresh perspectives on Green's distinctive visual language. *Heirloom* marks the debut of Green's iconic fist motif in tapestry form, rendered at an impressive scale. The artworks are available exclusively by application on HENI Editions from 15 May until 26 May at 17:00 BST.

Stars and Stripes features five framed silkscreen prints on Somerset Satin Cotton. The edition size of each print is limited to 25 (plus 5 APs). Each work measures 68 x 51 cm (framed) and is numbered and hand-signed on the front by the artist.

The prints are based on Green's original, spray-painted, mixed-media collages, which serve as a celebration of how the impossible can be achieved when people come together. By focusing on single, expressive hand gestures, the works evoke the legacy of social movements across time and place.

Heirloom is a Jacquard Woven Tapestry with 24k gold thread, made in an edition of 8 (plus 2 APs). Each tapestry measures 260 x 190 cm and is numbered and hand-signed by the artist on the label.

Heirloom marks the debut of Green's iconic fist motif in tapestry form. It focuses on the raised fist as an enduring global symbol of strength and solidarity, from Mandela's Amandla, to anti-fascists, to feminist groups through history. The artwork and its title refer to

the value of what we pass down across generations, including our individual and collective struggles and shared spirit of "we shall overcome".

The collection of works in this release centres on single hand gestures, from the peace sign to the raised fist. At the heart of the collection is Green's sustained interest in how we communicate. As she recalls, 'I've always been fascinated by body language and hand gestures, and all the ways we communicate without words.' Using her succinct visual language, which distils images almost to the point of abstraction while preserving critical form, Green transforms the scenes she experienced first-hand into powerful symbols of hope and progress.

The silkscreen prints and the tapestry are on display at the HENI Gallery from 15 - 23 May. Admission to the gallery is free.



Nicola Green is a British artist and social historian who takes an interdisciplinary approach, working at the intersection of contemporary visual storytelling and traditional portraiture.

Green is celebrated for her unique perspective that offers profound insights into the dynamics of legacy and representation, and how visual language can spark change. Green assumes the role of witness to momentous global events, creating artworks that preserve and reflect our shared heritage. Her practice explores how art can connect us to the past and illuminate hidden or forgotten histories; capture pivotal moments in the present; and inspire transformative visions for the future.

Green gained global recognition for her project *In Seven Days..* hailed by The Metropolitan Museum of Art as "an artistic and historic masterpiece." For her project, *Encounters*, she depicted religious figures such as Pope Francis, the Dalai Lama, and Archbishop Desmond Tutu.

Green co-founded and directed the Diaspora Pavilion at the 57th Venice Biennale, founded the Khadija Saye Arts programme at IntoUniversity, co-founded Sophia Point Rainforest Research Centre, and was a Principal Artist for The World Reimagined. Her work can be found in public collections, including The Obama Presidential Center, The Smithsonian National Portrait Gallery, The Metropolitan Museum of Art, and The Walker Art Gallery.





