

2. Summary

2.1. In the month of January, 194 sales of The Currency were made, totalling 1,002 ETH (\$2,998,617 USD). The sales represent a 19% increase in volume in ETH (10.6% decrease in USD) compared to December, when turnover was 842 ETH (\$3,353,692 USD) from 210 sales.

2.2. The average price in January was 5.17 ETH (\$15,456.79 USD), which was 28.8% higher than the average 4.01 ETH (\$15,969.96 USD) achieved in December (3.2% lower in USD).

2.3. Tenders were trading at around 4.8-5.5 ETH during January. The median price at the end of the month was 5.09 ETH, 1.7% lower compared to the start of the month (5.18 ETH).



2.4. As of 31st January, 7,386 wallets owned The Currency NFT, compared to 7,451 on 1st January.

2.5. 316 wallet addresses bought or sold at least one work in January. There were 157 unique buyer and 176 unique seller addresses. There were 122 new owners in January.


2.6. There were 109 repeat sales (bought and sold on the secondary market) of The Currency in January, with a median holding time of 75 days.

2.6.1. The median return for the seller was -2%.

2.6.2. The bottom 20% of the 109 trades lost more than 50% for the seller.

2.6.3. The top 20% of the 109 trades made more than 29% for the seller.


Distribution of Gain/Loss (ETH) per Repeat Sale Trade



3. Exchange Period

3.1. Holders of an NFT were able to exchange for the physical artwork from 14th October. By 31st January, 522 NFTs had been exchanged for the physical artwork. 82 NFTs were exchanged for the physical in January compared to 56 in December and 177 in November. NFTs were exchanged by 76 unique wallets. Only five wallets exchanged more than one NFT.

3.2. The following wallets exchanged more than one NFT for the physical last month. This activity is shown in the following table.

3.3. Of the 76 wallet addresses that exchanged an NFT only 13 still hold at least one *Currency* NFT.

4. Market Activity

4.1. In the month of January, 194 sales of The Currency were made, totalling 1,002 ETH (\$2,998,617 USD). The sales represent a 19% increase in volume in ETH (10.6% decrease in USD), compared to December, when the turnover was 842 ETH (\$3,353,692 USD) from 210 sales.

4.2. The average price in January was 5.17 ETH (\$15,456.79 USD), which was 28.8% higher than the 4.01 ETH (\$15,969.96 USD) achieved in December (3.2% lower in USD).


4.3. The top three prices paid in January were:

- 4.3.1. 10.99 ETH (\$34,296 USD) for #6196. *Stop fucking around* (18th January)
- 4.3.2. 7.5 ETH (\$17,790 USD) for #5422. *What about me?* (27th January)
- 4.3.3. 7.5 ETH (\$23,041 USD) for #980. *And if it all ends on the same day* (19th January)

4.4. The chart below plots each sale as a dot against its price in ETH.

Total sold: 194, turnover: ETH 1,002.




4.5. The yellow dots represent sales that have been made below the asking price of the work, and the green dots are sales made at the asking price. Of 194 sales, 31 (16%) were made below the asking price in January, compared to 30 sales out of 210 (14%) in December.

4.6. The maroon line is the smoothed price average (fitted using [loess](#) after ignoring the top three highest sales). The average price fluctuated between 4.5-5.8 ETH throughout the month.

4.7. This is the same chart as above, but sale prices have been converted to USD to negate the effect of ETH/USD movements. Whereas ETH prices have fluctuated, the dip in USD prices is more apparent as the ETH/USD rate continued to drop during January. Prices fell from highs of around \$20k at the start of the month to below \$15k at the end of the month.

Floor prices

4.8. The chart below tracks the lowest asking price ('floor') and the average of the ten lowest asking prices of The Currency throughout time (OpenSea only). The average of the ten lowest asking prices represents the depth of the floor and is more robust to outlier asking prices.

4.9. If the average of the ten lowest priced works is much higher than the floor, the floor price could move up very quickly as there is not enough liquidity at the floor price. The average of the ten lowest priced works is also resistant to noise caused by distressed sellers.


Floor Prices of The Currency on OpenSea

4.10. The trend on the floor is similar to the average prices in ETH. OpenSea floor was around 5.24 ETH at the start of January and 5.20 ETH at the end.


Daily Turnover in ETH



4.11. The daily turnover ranged between 12 and 55 ETH for most of January with a peak of 89.14 ETH on 24th January.

4.13. Most trades occur at the 'Buy Now' price on the OpenSea and HENI marketplaces. However, there are several trades that occur through the 'Accept Offer' function. The proportion of Buy Now vs Accept Offer trades per day can be seen below.





Price movements of The Currency vs ETH.


4.16. The charts below plot the prices of ETH and The Currency from August to the end of January.

ETH/USD Price (daily open/close)




4.17. ETH/USD opened January at around \$3,700 and closed at around \$2,700, marking a 27% reduction.


The Currency prices (daily median, in USD)



4.18. The chart below shows the return of ETH/USD against The Currency (in USD) on a daily basis. We can see that during volatile days when ETH/USD moves more than 5%, the price of The Currency (in USD) goes down.



4.19. The chart below plots the return of ETH against The Currency on a weekly basis. We observe a slight positive correlation between the weekly returns of ETH/USD against The Currency/USD.



Comparison of The Currency with other NFT projects

4.20. We compare the total volume of sales of The Currency with that of four other popular NFT projects. Note, the y axis is unique to each project due to the different range of prices. LooksRare sales for Meebits were ignored because of wash trading on the platform.

4.21. Note: All sale prices have been converted to ETH based on the rate at the time of sale.

4.22. In January, all five NFT projects had slightly bigger volumes compared to December.

4.23. The chart below shows the daily median price for each project. Please note, the y axis is different due to varying levels of median prices. LooksRare sales for Meebits were ignored because of wash trading on the platform.

Daily Median Prices of Popular NFT Projects




4.24. The median price of Bored Ape Yacht Club continued to increase rapidly, clearly overtaking CryptoPunks and finishing the month at 120 ETH.

4.25. Conversely, the median price for CryptoPunks had a rough start to the year, dipping from 80 ETH just before the New Year to around 60 ETH by mid-month. CryptoPunks made a strong recovery, reaching 94 ETH by the end of the month.

4.26. Meebits and The Currency prices were volatile during the crypto market crash at the start of the month and finished the month at roughly similar ETH prices.

4.27. The daily median price for works from the Art Blocks Curated set had some high sales at the start of the month, with its median price coming close to 5 ETH on 6th and 7th January. Its median price fell to 1 ETH, which is similar to the December levels towards the end of the month.

4.28. The graph below shows the performance of 1 ETH invested in different projects since 3rd August.



4.29. The table below shows the change of median sale price in ETH between 3rd August 2021 and 31st January 2022.

Repeat sales of Tenders

4.30. 176 unique Tenders were traded in January over 194 sales. Out of the 176 Tenders, 91 were sold before and 85 (48%) were sold for the first time. There are 109 pairs of repeat sales where the Tender was bought on the secondary market (at any time) and sold in January.

4.31. The median return from the 109 pairs of sales was -2% (over the initial buy price) and the median holding period was 75 days.

4.32. In the following chart we analyse the gains and losses made by traders reselling Tenders in the month of January. We report all gains net of fees (7.5% at OpenSea and 5% at HENI). We do not include the cost of bridging Tenders in the gains (losses).


4.34. All token charts share the same x and y axis to allow for the comparison of the timelines and prices across the different Tenders.

4.38. Compared to December when traders were taking losses (potentially due to tax reasons), a few short term traders made profits in terms of ETH in January.

Wallet activity

4.39. 316 wallet addresses bought or sold at least one token in January. There were 157 unique buyer and 176 unique seller addresses.

4.40. Of the 157 addresses who bought a token, 122 did not own a token before 1st January.

4.41. Of the 176 addresses that sold a token, 32 still hold at least one token and 144 have completely liquidated.

4.42. The 25 addresses below (or OpenSea usernames, where available) were a buyer or a seller in 66 (34%) of all trades in January.


4.44. Three of the top 25 holders added to their position in January, while three reduced.

4.45. 7,386 wallet addresses owned at least one *Currency* NFT by the end of January. This is down by 65 from the end of December. However, 63 wallet addresses exchanged all their holdings to physical works. Hence, excluding the effect of physical exchange, the decrease in number of owners is two.

4.46. 1,899 (19% of supply) unique tokens have been sold since the inception of the project.

4.47. By the end of January, the top 250 holders owned 1,107 out of 10,000 Tenders (excluding Damien Hirst's wallet). The top 1,000 wallets owned 2,093 out of 10,000 Tenders.

4.48. Since the secondary market opened, there has been a consolidation in the number of wallets holding Tenders. From 14th October, NFT holders were able to exchange their NFTs for physical artworks, which has reduced the number of wallets holding NFTs. As of 31st January, 7,386 wallets own a Tender.


Number of Wallets Holding NFTs



5.5. Both accounts continue to grow. The spike in follower growth on the @heni account was due to The Empresses print and NFT deed release.


6. Discord

6.1. In this chart we show the number of messages per day on the different channels in the HENI Discord server. The channels were created to discuss each of the three current NFT projects: *currency-chat*, *giza-chat* and *great-expectations-chat*. The period shown is from 1st to 31st January.


6.2. At the start of the month, the *currency-chat* channel averaged around 1,100 messages per day. Numbers went up at the end of the month after The Empresses editions drop announcement, reaching 2,901 messages on 28th January.

6.3. *great-expectations-chat* had a quiet month with around 70-100 daily messages.

6.4. *giza-chat* had around 230 messages daily throughout January. It had a peak of 1,014 messages on 21st January, fueled by discussion with JR's team member.




6.5. It is interesting to compare the messages on the HENI Discord server to those on the Discord servers for some of the other big NFT projects. The graph below shows a smoother comparison of the number of messages every day for each main channel on the corresponding server.



6.6. The BAYC server has seen the most activity this month, with 10-15k messages daily. The other servers have seen lower activity, with Meebits having the fewest messages, at 650 messages per day on average.


